

OCQUEOC TOWNSHIP BOARD/BUDGET HEARING
MARCH 27, 2023

A special meeting of the Ocqueoc Township Board for a budget hearing was held on March 27, 2023 at the Township Hall. All board members were present - Jerry Counterman, Jerome Isaacs, Susan Radka, Shari Pomranke and Pam Schaedig.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Counterman at 7:18 p.m. and began with the pledge to the flag.

Schaedig made a motion seconded by Radka, to move \$900 from Township Board Education to Township Board Salaries and Wages. M.C.

The proposed assessor contract was reviewed. A motion was made by Isaacs, supported by Radka, to sign the contract with Allan Berg. M.C. Radka mentioned that he was helpful with getting a map from BS&A for the Special Assessment District project.

The budget figures discussed at the March Board meeting were reviewed.

The 2023 – 2024 proposed township budget was finalized, and the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT OCQUEOC TOWNSHIP BUDGET
FOR 2023 – 2024

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Township of Ocqueoc to formulate a budget for the Township before the beginning of the fiscal year commencing April 1, 2023, and

WHEREAS, according to MCL 41, it is the responsibility of the Township Board to review and adopt the proposed budget for the township of Ocqueoc before the beginning of the fiscal year commencing April 1, 2023

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the proposed Ocqueoc Township budget for the fiscal year April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024 in the amount of \$309,595 , being reviewed at a special township board meeting, was approved and adopted at the special Township Board/Public Budget Hearing meeting dated March 27, 2023.



The Supervisor declared the resolution adopted.

The township currently has 2 CDs at Huron State Bank at .8%, but new CDs are available at 4.5%. Treasurer Pomranke reported that if those CDs were closed, there would be a 90-day penalty, but it would be made up with the higher interest rate on the new CDs. A motion was made by Schaedig, seconded by Radka, to allow Pomranke to close out CDs #1561 and #7766, take the 90-day penalty, and open new CDs at 4.5%. M.C.

A motion was made by Schaedig, seconded by Radka, to pay bills and adjourn. M.C.
The meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
