- Payments start July 1st – Sept 14th - There will be a penalty after Sept 14th.
- If you use a bill payment service, please make sure the parcel number is on it.
- There is a secured lockbox outside the township hall that you can put your taxes in.
- Please keep the bottom portion of your taxes along with your cleared check as your official receipt. If you'd like a separate receipt, send a self-addressed, stamped envelope, or we can email it to you.

Winter hours and days change

- Large Item Day is July 12th, 8:30am-3pm. Please be patient and polite, it is a busy day.
- We will have a list of all the taxpayers and will check you off the list as you come in.
- 1 load (pickup or trailer) per taxpayer, no matter how many parcels you own.
- If your load is excessive, we will charge accordingly.
- Items that are not allowed are Refrigerators, freezers, tires, concrete, stumps, brush, hazardous materials.

Updates to the Hall and Outdoor Center

- The Town Hall has a new floor, tables, chairs, updated kitchen, air conditioning, and a nice picnic area for you to enjoy. Contact the Clerk to use the hall for an event, it is free of charge for Ocqueoc Residents.
- The Friends of Ocqueoc Outdoor Center have all the funding in place for a new floating dock and a handicap accessible path to the dock. EMS Information

- The Onaway Plus subscription plan gives our community members a way to save on the potential cost of an ambulance bill. Just at \$70 dollars a year, it covers the whole family for July 1st to the following year June 30th. That is a single, a couple, or a family with all dependent children living at the one residence.
- If a person has no insurance the membership covers an Onaway area ambulance bill in full. If a person has insurance the ambulance company will bill your insurance company and whatever they pay will be considered payment in full. Many private insurance carriers have high deductibles of \$2,000 or more. The entire ambulance bill is many times applied to the deductible. Government insurance (Medicare) pays 80% of the approved amount and the patient still owes 20% of the approved amount.
- Onaway ambulance has an agreement with Cheboygan Life Support Systems to honor each other's subscription plans. That means if you are picked up in Onaway, Rogers City, Cheboygan, Indian River, or St. Ignace. You are covered by the Onaway Plus Membership Plan.
- It is mailed out every spring to all residences in our area. If you don't get once by the last week of May, please call 989-733-4166 and request a flyer. It may look like junk mail so keep an eye open for it. It could save you money on an ambulance bill.
